Enrollment

A current estimate of enrollment hovers between 700 new first-year students. This is still in flux and budget estimated 1639 returning students, presently this is tracking at approximately 1600. International student numbers are up slightly from last year, but vacillating as people wait for visas and navigate other impediments to arrive. The Chair thanked all faculty and staff for initiatives in reaching out to incoming and returning students over the summer to facilitate recruitment and retention. The Chair thanked Kutay Ulkuer and the recruitment team for helping to bring in one of the largest incoming classes Mount Allison has seen in years.

Residence

The budget estimated 936 students in residence, and there is presently a shortfall of 52 from that estimated number. These small shortfalls have significant impacts on the budget. Covid is the less than
